- Keep students organized, orderly, focused, attentive, on task, and productive.
- Minimize behaviors that impede learning.
- Maximize behaviors that facilitate learning.



Formative


Happens during the learning process.

- Performance Evaluates a specific task or assignment.
- Summative

Measures what a student has learned at the end of a learning period.

# Assessment Criteria

- Standards: How a performance will be evaluated.
- Performance: Specific speaking or writing task.
- Transparency: Students know the criteria, in advance.


